Articles and commentaries on tax matters of his authorship has been published in Journal of Taxation of Financial Institutions, Practical Latin American Tax Strategies, International Internet Law Review, Tax Planning International E-Commerce, as well as other international and domestic journals and newspapers. Mr. Nordemann served as teaching assistant of Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure at the University of Buenos Aires, School of Law (1991/92) and he has been Argentine speaker in tax conferences in the U.S. and Latin America for the last eight years.
