The North Carolina Bar Association's Minorities in the Profession Committee and YLD Bar Exam Committee announces a **Bar Exam Writing Clinic** to all interested persons sitting for the July North Carolina Bar Exam. The focus of the clinic is to provide bar candidates the opportunity to get real, practical information that will expose the various myths about the North Carolina Bar Exam. Participants will hear from a representative from the State Bar of Law Examiners who will cover topics such as how the bar exam questions are selected and scored. A panel of successful attorneys and judges will share their stories of surviving and conquering the bar exam. In addition, there will be a presentation on stress management, and participants will also have the opportunity to take part in a practice exam mini writing clinic, which will include tips on how bar candidates can improve their essay writing skills.

The clinic will be held on **Saturday, July 7, 2007** at two locations: the North Carolina Bar Association in Cary and the Charlotte School of Law in Charlotte. Sign-in begins at 8:30 a.m. at each site; the program will get under way at 9:00 a.m. There is no cost to attend the program, refreshments, and lunch will be provided. The program should end by 2:00 p.m.
