LIFT seeks to provide a substantive educational opportunity for K-12 and post-secondary educators on legal issues that arise within their schools and classrooms. Although educators are frequently confronted with issues that have legal implications, they rarely have the opportunity to receive substantive guidance on these issues. LIFT is designed to empower teachers with knowledge of the legal responsibilities placed on educators, as well as legal rights of students, parents, and teachers.

The LIFT program will provide up to four hours of continuing education opportunity for K-12 and post-secondary educators to explore the responsibilities and rights of educators in North Carolina.
